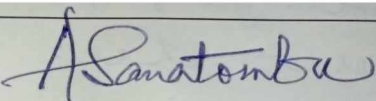

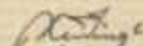

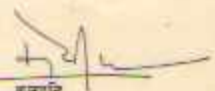

The Problems of the Aged Persons of Imphal City: A Sociological Study

Abujam Sanatomba Singh*

Abstract: The aged people are a problem not only to their family but also to the society. Their problem is one of the social pathology. It is a period when people move away from previous more desirable period or time of usefulness. Age sixty is generally considered the dividing line between middle and old age. There are such differences among individuals in the age at which ageing actually begins to a better living conditions and better health care. Most men and women do not show the mental and physical sign of ageing until the mid-sixties or the early seventies. For these reasons there is a gradual trend towards using 65 years as the age of retirement. The present article will cover the problem experienced by the retired male teachers of government schools and their problems like financial constraint, health problems and socio-psychological problems. There are individual differences in the effect of ageing. There are many types of old people.

Keywords: Aged people, Social & psychological problem, retired male teachers, definition: Ageing can be viewed as a life event in which an individual changes at overnight from an active whole life to an inactive life and this requires reorganization of life and adjustments. Ageing is viewed as a period of adjustment where multiplicity of problem confronts the individuals.

Different definitions and conceptualization of ageing have been employed by scientists from time to time and no definite criteria are fixed by biologist to consider someone old. Old Age, as we know is the closing period in the life span; it is period when people move away from previous more desirable period to time of decline. There are different stereotype about aged, the aged are often stereotyped unfavorably in different forms of the mass media. The common stereotype of the Aged is that of men and women who are worn out physically and mentally who are pushed aside to make way for younger generation. According to this stereotype, "Young is beautiful and old is ugly".

International convention considers the Age of 64 to be old but in the India at 60 plus age group is considered to constitute the old person. Ageing is a natural phenomenon, but the increased scientific concern for old Age is a recent development thereby increasing the population of elderly persons above 60 years. The problem of old age has emerged as a social one, to some extent owing to increasing proportion of the Aged people in the industrial society of the present time. The problems being encountered by the aged people in the changing times, particularly in developing countries, have been drawing attention of the social scientist, social scientist government agencies and social workers. Our society has undergone a phenomenal transformation due to technological innovations, reduced distances, breaking up of the joint family system and attitudes of younger generation and the people in general towards old Age. All these have accelerated and multiplied the problems of the elderly people in the modern times. The Aged could disengage themselves from life to any extent even to futility and

consequently their position of respect has undergone immense changes. An attitude of reverence towards the Aged was considered a venture.

The field site of this Sociological study is Imphal, the capital city of Manipur. Manipur is one of the North Eastern States of India which has become its integral part since 1949. Manipur has a population of approximately 25 lakhs persons (2011 census) [Male: 1561952 & Female: 1131944] including Meeteis, the dominant community in the state, 33 Scheduled Tribes, 7 Scheduled Caste communities and people from the other states of India. The city is divided into two districts namely Imphal West and Imphal East and 28 municipal wards. The population of Imphal city in 2011 is 268243 of which male and female are 130735 and 137508 respectively.

The present article focuses on the problems faced by male teachers who retired from service up to end of 2004. To get more reliable data from the respondents, 50 retired teachers, belonging to different communities and religious groups have been interviewed. The retirement age of government employees in Manipur is 60 years.

Present Scenario of Common Problems of the Aged Persons: When a person attained the age which we term as aged person, it is natural that this group of persons need to face some problems of one kind or the other. Some of the common problems faced by the aged people/persons can be as follows:

1. Physiological Problem: Old age is a period of physical decline. The physical condition depends partly upon hereditary constitution, the manner of living and Environmental factors, vicissitudes of living, faulty diet, malnutrition, infections, intoxication, glutomy, inadequate rest, emotional stress, overwork, endocrine disorders. Environmental condition like heat and cold are some of the secondary causes of physical decline. Mental disorder is very much associated with old age. Older people are susceptible to Psychotic depression.

2. Emotional Problem: Decline in mental ability of aged person makes them dependent. They no longer have ability or judgment but still they want to get involved in all family matters and business issues. Due to generation gap the youngsters do not pay attention to their suggestions and advice. Instead of developing a sympathetic attitude towards the old, they start asserting their rule and power. This may create a feeling of deprivation of their dignity and importance.

3. Financial Problem: Retirement from service usually result in loss of an adequate income and the pension that the elderly receive are usually inadequate to meet the cost of living which is always on the rise, with the reduced income they are reversed from the state of "chief bread winner to a mere dependent" though they spend their providently fund on marriages of children, acquiring new property, education of children and family maintenance. The diagnosis and treatment of these diseases created more financial problem for Aged persons.

4. Social Problem: The Aged persons suffer social losses greatly because of the loss with Age. Their social life is narrowed down by loss of work associated with it, relatives, friends and spouse and poor health restrict their participation in social activities. The home becomes the center of their social life and they are confined to the interpersonal relationship with the family members. Due to loss of most of the social roles they once performed, they are likely to be lonely and isolated. Social

chronic health problem also made them socially isolated leading to loneliness and depression.

Scenario in Imphal City: Human being has a problem at all the stages of life. After getting retirement the following are the some of the problems faced by the Aged person in Imphal city.

Problems of Health: The health of an individual begins to deteriorate with the average age of health of an individual. Individual who may have never been sick begin to show signs of declining health as he gets older. The physical stamina of individuals also shows a decline in old age. The individual in his old age is more concerned about his failing health. The problem of failing health is considered to be much more acute among the retired person than to the old people in general.

The most common complaints pertaining to health of the aged persons in Imphal City are:-

In addition to finding difficulties in performing a variety of activities by the respondents also experienced suffering from a variety of ailments some of the respondents also experienced in ability to participate in actively, which required more physical energy. It is found that 30% of the respondent from the Age group 65-68 said that they experienced some difficulties in doing manual work well. 40% of the respondent from the age group 69 & above revealed that they are unable to do manual work and climbing stairs. It is found that 54.4 % of the respondents expressed that they required medical treatment more often well 45.6% expressed that they did not required medical treatment.

Financial Problem: All the respondents expressed that if a person get pension about one half of the basic salary at the time of retirement, it is difficult for an individual to live on such a reduced income. It is revealed that a number of family members commitment such as education of their children, marriage of their sons and daughters. Thus it is found that indebtedness constitute a dominant characteristics of the respondents. Only a few respondents have been having acute financial problem.

Socio-Psychological Problem: One of the important problems of retirement is that of utilizing the leisure time that is now available in abundance to them. Prior to retirement of the individual is accustomed to work and has a problem of making use of these extra hours which are now at his disposal. One may dilute oneself by saying that after retirement he/she would take it an easy and relaxed. However they might find it rather difficult. As mentioned in the International encyclopedia of Sociology, the first question asked in such acquaintance is 'what do you do ...?' The answer reflects a major part of person's identity as well as their status. Retired are in danger of feeling worthless, no longer capable of being productive contributors of the society. People is trying to interact themselves with the other people of the same community. Therefore utilization of extra leisure one's identity could be a real problem of the aged persons. On the activities like reading, watching TV, the reduction is very slight, comparatively.

Comparatively fewer individual are pursuing their interest after retirement. This may be because of two reasons namely failing health and strained financial

constraint. Since the retired people have so much of extra time available it is feasible that some of them may get bored and may not know what to do with their extra time. In western countries this is very common complaint of the western people. To get rid of their boredom they state that they play with their grandchildren or watching TV to get relief from boredom. Retired persons have lot of extra time with other people of deterrent community in Imphal city. One respondent could think of their human resources in voluntary social work.

Some of respondent have mentioned that local welfare organizations as their special interest. In short only 40 % thought of the problem of retirement as important enough and had discussed with their friends and colleagues, spouse or relatives of their siblings.

Conclusion: The present survey by and large reveals a positive self perception of the retired people. They affirmed with the old Age and elders are fabricated by the society. All of them are staying with the family members mostly spouse and children. None of them are staying alone. Isolation and loss of status in the family which are often regarded as important problem of retirement. Their family members respect them as the need of the family. The younger age group and below are willing to start their own business for a steady additional income. They still consider themselves economically quite gainful to their family. The younger generation also do feel that retired parents do get adjust to the situation. The retired people are not rejected by the younger generation in their homes. The two generation are able to co-exist without many visible sign of conflict. On the whole they perceive of themselves as an adjusted satisfied and socially aware and responsible person. They are much anxious about their children unemployment. Majority of them are free from any financial debt though there is an overall reduction of activities they pursue as their special interest in comparison youth days, boredom is not a serious problem for them a considerable number of them are engaged in voluntary social work and some more are willing to offer voluntary services their family members respect them, and treat them, as the need of the family. The younger generation does feel that their aged parents to get adjust to the situation. There is need to adopt suitable measures to provide for better life of the Aged persons. Efforts are needed in the problem of adjustment, medical, Health and financial assistance etc. So, the govt. and voluntary organization should concentrate first on giving sufficient and physical security to the aged people.

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Female Street Vendors with Particular Reference to Nagamapal Area of Imphal City: A Sociological Study

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Abstract: The street vendor is broadly defined as a person engaged in vending of less goods, wares, food items or merchandise of everyday use or offering services to the general public, in streets, foot paths, pavements, at large without having a permanent built up structure from which to sell. The field site of this sociological study is Nagamapal area of Imphal city, the capital of Manipur. The causes for the growth of street vending in Imphal city were the lack of gainful employment coupled with poverty in rural areas. This has pushed people out of villages and hill districts in search of a better existence in the cities. These people do not possess the skill or the education to enable them to find better paid, regular employment in the formal sector and they do settle to work in the informal sector. The poverty compelled women have to become vendors. Lack of employment and good market shed to sell their goods comfortably in the main market is a great problem for them. As a result they become time to time street vendors and faces different type of problems in adjusting in Imphal city. There is specific market shed for female street vendors who are selling goods on the road of the naga mullah of Imphal city. Street vendors suffer from low income and belong to a low socio-economic condition and educational level and they faces ill treatment of the customer. As the central plain is mainly covered by Meiteis they regard greater vendors as compared with other communities like the Nagas, Khasis, Meitei pangala, and Nepalis. They all have their own culture, belief, faith, tradition and value which made them to put up a way of life according to their various grounds and potential capabilities.

Keywords: Street vendors, Ethnic component, Problems

Introduction: The survey of Nagamapal market area includes time consuming task questioning every individual female on their social, economic and personal life. I viewed besides encouraging them to share their grievances and problems. Most of the female vendors heeded to our interruption though confused and tired. The course of my survey opened my eyes towards understanding the way of life of Manipur are struggling for their livelihood. This is what we say 'Poverty is the madist of plenty' which is prevailing in the state of Manipur today. The geographical area of Nagamapal is confined in the Imphal-west side of Imphal Municipal Corporation. It is located between Kanglabi Leirak to BT fly over bridge (an area of 1/2 and 3/4 sq. km of the total area of 1843 sq. km of Imphal city).

Nagamapal is becoming a place full of garbage. It is located on the bank of the Imphal River in the heart of the city, the capital of Manipur. Due to the lack of proper management, the place has become congested and hazardous for the normal flow of traffic in the area. Owing to the vast multitude of customers who throng the market, the length and breadth of the road has been so congested having only enough space for a two wheeler vehicles. Within this small congested area many people busy earning of their livelihood. It is also a place where passenger vehicles are parked on both sides of the road. Since Nagamapal area is a small part of the trade area of Imphal city, it plays a very essential role in supporting a number of people of Manipur. Different ethnic communities are selling various types

of commodities such as vegetables, dry fish, beverages, flower pots, from Mao and fruits like lemon produced in Kachui, Ukhrul District and oranges from Tamenglong District, live fish from Loktak Lake and other hill and valley districts of Manipur. Hence, it is indispensable place for the people Manipur, both buyers and sellers of commodities. Questioning these vendors during my survey day after day has made it clear that almost all of them share the same problems and hardships.

Composition: Nagamapal bazaar is constituted of different ethnic communities in the Nagamapal area. The vendors have their own culture, belief, faith, religion, hope and value of which made them to put up a way of life according to their vendors background and potential capacity. As they all come from different district of Manipur, they performed formal traditional ritual to their respective gods to bless and protect them from danger throughout the day before they sell their goods. The majority of them (60%) are the Meiteis and (10%) Meitei Pangal community. The minority about 30% comprises of different tribal communities. Prominent among them were vendors belonging to Thadou, Paite, Anal, Hmar, etc. Vendors belonging to communities outside Manipur such as Biharis could also be found but were outnumbered by the locals. In our utter district, more than half approximately 40% of them belonged to the age group of 30 plus and above. The remaining 30% belong to the age group of 35-55 years and 10% to the age group of 25-35 years. A few among them were educated but were compelled to the business out of poverty. Moreover in some exceptional cases, they tend to be illiterate and unmotivated unlike their female coworkers. These vendors constitute the whole stratum of society - married, divorced, and orphaned, widow, widower etc and all age groups. They also constitute of diverse culture, religion, language, ethnic etc.

Despite dissimilarity in language, religion and culture, these female street vendors have shown great harmony among themselves. Their composition is devoid of any racial discrimination. They have the utmost respect for each other's religion and language. The unity in diversity shown by these female street vendors is due to several factors. Firstly, they share the greenness in terms of impromptu shelter and shed. They are the victims of impromptu management and physical problems. Being compelled by their poverty they share the same hardships which bind them together and put them on the same platform against life dissimilarity. Thirdly, most of them belong to the same age group which makes it easier to find company and friends.

Socio-economic and Educational Status: Almost 90% of the female street vendors are from poverty ridden families. Chandra was severely injured in a car accident besides being poor was a regular drinker. She hardly managed to get her 4th grade government high school while her parents died. Mother had no other option but to sell vegetables to clear out a living. Daughter of Chandra is not a regular vendor during her school days. She had a dream of becoming a doctor but matriculation examination her mother died and her father abandoned her. He is the husband of his new wife. With no other means to support himself, he is a regular vendor. Vegetables. There are several other cases of female street vendors who lost their education out of poverty. Marichelli also could not continue her education. She claims as her parents could not afford to pay for her education. She is a regular vendor to sell vegetables to add to the family income as her father is a regular vendor. Meitei Pangal namely Bahini Begum has a different story. She is a regular vendor

education has become more advanced till today. But unfortunately, these female vendors could not attain higher level of education to equip themselves to obtain prestigious jobs. The educational percentage of female vendor is very low. About 70% of them were illiterate but devoid of higher studies and 20% of them being almost illiterate. The remaining belong to the rare cases of educated female street vendors. With such knowledge it is not possible to bring any alternative way for better life. This is due to various improper effort of family and their forefather thought that their life was made to assume domestic responsibility from an early age. They are expected to do domestic work in order to make free their mother to go out of home for undertaking economically rewarding activities same as they do now in the family. This is something inherited from their parent and some of them are forced to get married earlier due to poverty. Moreover, they are tradition-bound people who do not know the real value of education. This has made them to degrade their future education. Therefore, they have to suffer as on their fate of which forefather had sown seed and they have to be remained as under life until their children replaced by prestigious job as source of the family. Poverty is the sole impediment towards their education. Their social statuses were also in a deplorable condition. Apart from their household problems, the stigma of being a vendor adds fuel to their plights and sorrows in the society. The meager sums they earn hardly rescue them in times of grave financial need thus failing them in their endeavour to elevate their social, economic and educational status.

The social and economic status of all female street vendors was unstable, totally dependent on them and their daily earnings. On top of that, in some cases, the educational continuity of their children also dependent on them. The economic conditions almost uncertain and social status is more deplorable. Financial assistance from the government seems to be their only hope salvation.

Problems: Lack of proper sanitation is a common factor for female street vendors in Nagamapal area. The environment and atmosphere pollution is worse than the last decade of Imphal as a whole. Since the Imphal Municipality Corporation is ceasing from the work openly and lack of taking up necessary developmental measure, it causes a feeling of dissatisfaction to everyone. Street vendors are related to with uncertainty in income on one side, low socio-economic condition and educational level and ill behavior of the customer. Thus, vendors faced a problem of unpleasant smell from the garbage and solid waste. And even break out epidemics among them due to various activities in the polluted area. Continuous increase in Imphal city put heavy pressure on goods transportation and traffic system. In this connection, heavy pressure made the traffic system worsen, besides the road, female occupied the foot path for affording economic forces. Since the female street vendors are illegal in the eye of authority, the traffic police was considered as fierce animal like tiger in Nagamapal area. All these restrictions made them feel so unrest to earn a penny in the short duration. Not only these problems they face inadequate shelter, unavailability of accommodation. This nonconform situation distracts most of their customers. Street vendors are related with uncertainty in income (Kumar, R. & Singh, A. 2013). On one side, because of the low socio-economic profile street vendor customer behavior is common, and on other side street vendors faces harassment by police officials for occupying important traffic junction (Karthikeyan, R. & Mangalwarman, R. 2013). They have long hour of work without rest and lack of urban amenities. Climate adds to their woes through rain, scorching heat and chilly winters blizzard together by goods vendors and other nonconformity accommodation location. Chatterjee, 2010; Widespread,

vendors while conducting urban planning, street or land use planning. There is substantial increase in the number of the female street vendors in Imphal city due to unorganized set up infrastructure beyond the periphery of the Imphal city such as Singjamet super market, Kongba, Lamphel, Kwakeithel, Lamding etc. Perhaps a conflict situation may occur at any day between the license holder and the female street vendors because of pushed female street vendors out of their village towards Imphal city. All the female street vendors will be accommodated in the designated vending zone. In case, it cannot be accommodated in the same vending zone, allocation of space will be made by drawing of lots. However, those who fail to get space in the same vending zone will be accommodated in adjoining vending zone.

Policies and Plan of the Street Vendors Act 2014: Street vendors (Protection of livelihood and Regulation of street vending) Act, 2014 is an Indian legislation aimed to regulate street vendors in public areas and protect their right with key highlights. Town vending committee will be responsible for conducting a survey of all the vendors under its jurisdiction, and survey has been made and a certificate of vending has been issued.

1. **The Street Vendors Policy 2014:** Aimed at providing social security and livelihood rights to street vendors.

2. **Model Street Vendors Bill 2009:** For Protection of livelihood and Regulation of street vending, all States and Union Territory governments for creation of state legislation, however it had no legal binding, thus few governments made the progress in this regard.

3. **Verdict of Supreme Court of India, 2010:** The Court recognized street vending as source of livelihood, directed the ministry to work out on a central legislation, and of same was unveiled to the public on November 11, 2011.

4. **Street Vendors Act 2014:** The Act protects legitimate street vendors from harassment by police and civic authorities. It facilitates designation of vending zones on the basis of traditional natural markets, proper representation of vendors and women in decision making, establishment of effective grievance and dispute resolution mechanism.

Conclusion: There are so many deficiencies and shortcomings of Imphal city. The condition of Imphal market which is supposed to be finest place in Manipur is made less attractive to everyone. Sometimes a little change was taking place among the female street vendors on the basis of time sharing. Most probably, the street vendors take nearly 4.30 a.m. to 6.30 a.m. in selling their goods. After those other random female street vendors occupy the same place, moreover, some vendors will come first serve' rules. At the end of the day some of the vendors are still selling out their vegetables to finish selling their items. There is traffic congestion frequently at this area during evening time. We have heard many complains and many protest from different organizations against the inaction of the state government. Roadside Vendors Welfare Association president told us that the govt. has been playing with the lives of street vendors by sharing their space. Frequently, she demanded that the Street Vendors (Protection of livelihood and Regulation of street vending) Act 2014 should be implemented as soon as possible. She continued that the government should take the decision alone in shifting their location. This also demanded a law to be enacted and self protection. It also makes to decide in the government's jurisdiction in different entire part of the market in the Imphal city. Therefore, the following points are essential to be imposed into action.

1. The Municipal administration must have sufficient financial resources to undertake developmental programmes for the benefit of the jobless dweller.
2. Sufficient care is to be taken to control pollution and impart awareness in order to maintain cleanliness in the city.
3. The city administrator or planner must have far-sightedness in taking development progress like drainage system, road construction, sanitation and market shed.
4. The municipality must always be consulted to see whether they have any objection to the selling and whether any requirement must be met with.
5. Special rules apply to female street vendors in the Imphal city.
6. They may not be sell tobacco, alcohol, soft drink, including burnt items or over the counter medicines.

Suggestion: I would like to extend my suggestion for the Imphal city as far as female street vendors are concerned that it should be made clear cut long term plan of being more advanced development and progress for the new future generation. Therefore, though the problem could not be completely solved, we could keep them under manageable limits and find effective solution for some of them if the state government implements the above suggestions. The city administrator, the govt of Manipur could not be solved the problem alone but city dweller and stake holders should take an active role and must be prepared to co-operate with the administration in the removal of these problems. The construction and planning for the female street vendors should be from the perceptions of the business of the small and marginalized street business. Transparency is not in the current policy and management of municipality, which should be transparent at the time of making solution for the vendors.
